#### 1. Describe the interaction between Rowdy and Junior just after Mary's wake.

Junior sprints into the woods to escape the graveyard and runs right into Rowdy, who is crying. Rowdy denies his feelings even though Junior attempts to empathize with him, and Rowdy tries to punch Junior but misses. Junior laughs at him, which makes Rowdy cry more, and Rowdy tells him that it is Junior's fault that Mary has died and professes that he hates Junior.

#### 2. Why does Miss Warren get Junior out of his chemistry class, and how does she react to Junior?

Miss Warren, the guidance counselor, gets Junior out of class to tell him that his sister had died. She wouldn't tell him why or let him go outside to wait for his dad because it was cold, but Junior does anyways. She is shocked at his defiance and tries to chase him but quickly has to stop and let him go.

#### 3. What does Junior do immediately after the basketball game against Wellpinit and why?

#### 5. What were two of the myths about the lake or how it received its name?

He has a nightmare that he ate so much cantaloupe at a picnic that he turned into one and then smacked a wasp on his face that had been trying to suck the sugar out of his cheek, which had actually happened in real life. Before having the nightmare, he remembered that his sister had always loved eating that melon even though he had always hated it.

## 9. How does Junior ultimately respond to the sports guy after repeated only saying that he feels weird?

He apologizes and tells the guy that he is just nervous and angry about all that has happened. He says that he feels like he has so much to prove in this game and has never wanted anything more in his life than to win the game.

#### 10. At the graveyard with Junior and his parents, why does Junior's dad say, "It's all love and death."?

Junior's dad is making a statement about the simplicity of life by recognizing the need to spend the life we do have loving each other in order to cope and prepare for death.
