<b>539 BC</b>	<b>Cyrus the Great's Cylinder</b>
	- the first human rights declaration
<b>1215</b>	<b>The Magna Carta</b>
	- gave people new rights and made the king subject to the law
<b>1628</b>	<b>The Petition of Right</b>
	- set out the rights of the people
<b>1776</b>	<b>The U.S. Declaration of Independence</b>
	- proclaimed the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness
<b>1789</b>	<b>The Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen</b>
	- French document stating that all citizens are equal under the law
<b>1948</b>	<b>The Universal Declaration of Human Rights</b>
	- first document listing the 30 rights to which everyone is entitled
