







Growing up & Family

Breaking The Silence



Francois Mauriac

- AFTER THE War, HE LIVED IN FRANCE and STUDIED AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PARIS
- He worked as a translator and a reporter
- He met francois Mauriac, WHO urged Him to Break His Silence
 Write about the camps
- IN 1958, HE WYOTE AN 800-PAGE BOOK IN YIDDISH TITLED: AND THE WOYLD HAS REMAINED SILENT
- IT Was shortened & translated To French & English in 1960
- In 1986, He won the Nobel Peace Prize
