Writing the Body Paragraphs for our Expository Essay Using Human Rights

Body Paragraphs: Making An Assertion

Assertion: a statement or claim an author makes about a specific topic

- Assertions need to be proved with evidence to support your claim
- Evidence needs to come from a reliable source

Body Paragraphs: Assertions Supported by Evidence **Evidence:** something used to prove the claims in an assertion • Evidence comes from reliable sources Most Newspapers & Magazines Most Websites (.org, .edu, .gov) Libraries and Government Buildings

Writing Body Paragraphs: 3 Simple Steps



 Step 1
 Your first sentence must be an assertion (statement or claim) about one of your focus Human Rights. (1 sentence)

Writing Body Paragraphs: 3 Simple Steps Step 2

- Include the evidence you have found to prove your assertion. (1-2+ sentences)
 - In-text citation: Mention
 (1) where the quote came from
 (source) and (2) the author's name
- Operation Does your evidence connect with your assertion?

Writing Body Paragraphs: 3 Simple Steps



Step 3 • Explain/analyze the evidence and how it connects to the **specific** Human Right you are discussing in this paragraph. (2-3+ sentences)

Body Paragraph: Step 1 Identifying Your Assertion

The first sentence of each of your body paragraphs must be a statement you make about the Human Right you are writing about.

- What is the first Human Right you want to write about?
- Make a statement about this Human Right.

 Example: The Human Right to seek a safe place to live is being acknowledged/supported/ amended/violated/abused/ignored/neglected around the world.

Body Paragraph: Step 2 Show Your Evidence

- Your evidence will be either...
 - 1. A statistic or number
 - 2. A personal account/direct quote
- Where did this evidence come from?
 - Name of article and name of author
 - Example: In an article from LA Youth magazine titled, "My Life as a Homeless Teen," William Dominguez writes/reports/says, "I grew up in an abusive family. When I was little, I would stay out as long as I could to avoid getting beat. When I was 5, my dad burned me on the stove."

Body Paragraph: Step 3

Explain the Evidence In Your Own Words

- Show exactly how your evidence connects to the Human Right you are talking about in this paragraph
 - Example: Based on this evidence, it is clear that the Human Right to seek a safe place to live is being violated because children are being abused in their own homes. Children as young as 5-years-old do not have the ability to escape from bad situations on their own. Instead, they end up suffering in terrible living conditions.

Completed Paragraph
